Illogical Love: Part 6- The Most Illogical Love Luke 15:1-2 and 11-24; 1 John 4:10; 1 John 1:9; John 1:12-13

- A. Review
 - 1. Series
 - 2. Marriage, Family, Work, Conflict
 - 3. Go back and watch
- B. True love is illogical
 - 1. It's a choice. Not a feeling
 - 2. Based on submission- willingly giving all of me for what benefits you the most.
- C. One relationship that we've only touched on
 - 1. It's the theme that's been running throughout... just behind the scenes.
 - 2. Relationship that affects every other...glue that holds all of them together
 - 3. Get this one right and you can get all of them right
 - 4. For many it's the most illusive/frustrating/illogical
 - 5. Our Relationship with God
 - 6. A healthy relationship with God paves the way for healthy relationships with others.
 - 7. The key to it all is the most illogical love ever seen.

I. WE

A. Two main views on a relationship with God

- 1. **Skeptic** God doesn't care. Uninterested. We can never know for sure what he wants or is like.
 - a. Leads to fear of unknown- Maybe you're in maybe you're out
 - b. Does anything really matter?
- 2. Religious God really cares how you act. Waiting to get you. Do everything you can to make him like you.
 - a. Leads to fear of unknown- maybe you're in maybe you're out?
 - b. Extreme rule following.
 - c. Hypocrisy
 - d. Judgmentalism
- 3. How every religion (ancient or modern) sees a relationship with God.
- 4. We all tend to lean one way or the other
- B. There's another view... the illogical one.
 - 1. Doesn't make any sense.
 - 2. But it's the one Jesus taught.
 - 3. It's so illogical that he had to prove it.
- C. A lot of the confusion and differences between these views has to do with the idea of *SIN*.
 - 1. Breaking the law of love.
 - a. Love God. Love your neighbor.
 - 2. Sinner- Someone who knows better but does it anyway.
 - 3. We've all sinned. We're all sinners.

- D. And sin makes us do one of two things... hide or bribe.
 - 1. We either try to hide from God.
 - a. Say, "Oh he doesn't care, he doesn't exist"
 - b. Or just really not allow ourselves to think those deep thoughts... shut them out.

2. Or we try to bribe him

- a. "I'll do these good things so you won't punish me"
- b. "I won't do these bad things so you'll like me"
- c. "Hopefully my good will outweigh my bad enough to convince you to like me."
- 3. Think about it, neither of these responses do anything to give us a healthy relationship with God.
 - a. Would it be a healthy way to interact with other people?
 - b. Can't have a healthy relationship if you are always hiding or bribing.
 - c. There would always be something between you... separating you.

d. Hiding and bribing separate us from our Heavenly Father

E. So what do we do?

- 1. Jesus actually told us the solution.
- 2. It's not hide or bribe... it's admitting and trusting.
- 3. Whenever Jesus talked about sin (it was a lot) it was always in the context of restoration... restoring a healthy relationship with God.

III. GOD (Luke 15:1-3 and 11-24)

A. Background

- 1. One day Jesus is surrounded by two groups of people... those who were trying to hide (skeptics) and those who were trying to bribe (religious)
- 2. And he realized neither of these groups really knew what it meant to have a healthy relationship with God. And How God actually viewed sin.
- 3. So he told three stories about lost things... things that were separated from their proper place.
 - a. Sheep, coin...
- 4. Son.
- 5. Completely turned how people view God and a relationship with him upside down.

B. Luke 15:1-3

1. The two groups.

C. Luke 15:11-12

- 1. "You just won't die... give me my share."
- 2. Deserved to be stoned under their laws...

D. Luke 15:13-16

- 1. Relationship is broken
- 2. Tries to do everything he can to hide

E. Luke 15:17

1. Realizes hiding is not working out

F. Luke 15:18-19

- 1. Is honest that he broke the relationship
- 2. Acknowledges that he has SINNED... "I have sinned"- Maybe someone here has never uttered those words...
- 3. So he's going to try a new tactic... bribe.
- 4. He's gotta try to make up for what he did.
- 5. He knows life is better with his father (everyone listening knew father represented God).
 - a. Revolutionary idea.
- 6. But the father is going to be mad (only logical conclusion)... so he's gonna have to earn his father's approval. And grovel and slave away.
- 7. But he obviously didn't know his father very well.

G. Luke 15:20

- 1. Is the Father mad? (Extrapolate)
- 2. "While he was still a long way off."
- 3. "Filled with compassion"
- 4. God is not mad at you.
- 5. He is broken hearted over the separation sin has caused.
- 6. He longs for you to be restored to Him.

H. Luke 15:21-24

- 1. Son tries to give his speech but the Father doesn't even listen.
- 2. There's no, "I told you so." Or "How dare you think you can come back." Or "Do you know what this did to your mother?"
- 3. There's no need.
- 4. The son has admitted that he broke the relationship and now the father is ready to celebrate that they are restored.

- 5. The father never stopped loving his son... he was just waiting for the son to be willing to restore the relationship.
- I. Hiding and bribing do nothing about our sin, they only separate us from our Heavenly Father.
 - 1. Admitting our sin does everything.
 - 2. Admitting our sin brings forgiveness and restoration.
 - 3. Why is it so simple? Why is that all it takes?
 - a. If God is really a good God, why does he let all the hurt and evil we've done to others just go? Why don't we have to grovel, and work, and bribe?
 - b. B/C... The work has already been done for you.
 - c. 1 John 4:10 (NLT)

J. <u>Gospel</u>

- 1. Grace
 - a. Can't earn it, don't deserve it
- 2. Sin
 - a. Can't do anything about it ourselves.
- 3. God
- 4. Jesus
- 5. Faith
 - a. It's a choice
 - b. Not forced
- K. God's love is so illogical b/c it's so simple
- L. It's illogical b/c it's so undeserved
- M. It's illogical b/c it's so powerful.

a. 1 John 1:9

D. Communion.

IV. YOU

- A. God's love is illogical but it's true.
 - 1. We don't have to hide
 - 2. We don't have to bribe.
 - 3. We simply have to admit and trust.
- B. It's time to make a choice
 - 1. Choose to trust His illogical love.
 - 2. "It's too easy!" I told you it's illogical.
 - 3. Admit and trust
 - 4. If you've never had a moment in your life...
- C. Maybe you have before... Know and rely on His love.

1. John 1:12-13

- 2. Might be time to renew that trust.
- 3. Stop trying to bribe and simply rely on his illogical love.

V. WE

- A. Having a healthy relationship with God paves the way for healthy relationships with others...
- B. B/c of God's illogical love
 - 1. We can submit to others b/c he submitted for us
 - 2. We can serve b/c he has served us
 - 3. We can forgive b/c he forgave us
 - 4. We can truly and illogically love b/c true illogical love died for us
