## II. WE

- A. There's a gap between who we want to be and who we are.
- B. Think about it... what did you actually want to be doing when you reached this age...

1. I wanted to be a \_\_\_\_\_ but I'm just a \_\_\_\_\_.

- 2. By the time I was \_\_\_\_\_ I wanted to have accomplished \_\_\_\_\_ or been promoted to \_\_\_\_\_.
- 3. I thought retirement would be like a summer vacation everyday, but it's just become routine... what am I supposed to do?
- 4. Or I'm just trying to get through school... someday I'll be able to do something that REALLY matters
- C. I want(ed) to be doing something I'm passionate about!
  - 1. It's hard to have passion when there's no compelling purpose b/c purpose creates passion.

- D. Purpose of work...
  - 1. To get ahead of either co-workers or competition,
  - 2. Produce/sell more products and make more money.
  - 3. Get through another year so you are a step closer to retirement
  - 4. Get through another phase of your kids so you can hopefully have it easier when they are older.
  - 5. Get through another grade...
  - 6. Get to another vacation...
- E. Most of our life becomes monotonous, routine, dry... not at all what we had hoped for...
- F. Jesus actually talks about this.
  - 1. And his solution is so simple but so counterintuitive.
  - 2. But whether JF or not it is some of the best career advice you'll ever get.
  - 3. And whether you're traditionally employed or not this will change everything you "have-to" do.
  - 4. This one simple idea you can change any job/work into a source of purpose.
  - 5. To be who you want to be, make people your purpose.

## III. GOD (Matthew 20:25-28)

# A. Background.

- 1. Matthew
- 2. Story...
- 3. James and John have mom ask Jesus to make them  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  in Kingdom
- 4. Jesus, "You don't know what you're talking about."
- 5. "It's not up to me."
- 6. Other disciples hear about it... pissed.
- 7. Jesus used it to teach something that can change your life, business and really could change the world...

## B. V. 25

- 1. "Yeah, that's how the world works."
- 2. "That's why we can't wait for you to take over and we can rule over everyone!"
- 3. "Isn't that why we've been working so hard?"
- 4. Isn't that why **you've** been working so hard?
- 5. To be able to have people work for you? So you can call the shots?
- 6. So you can have some freedom and peace?

## C. V. 26-28

- 1. "Ah crap! I knew he was going to say something like that!"
- 2. According to Jesus the secret to greatness is being FOR others.
- 3. Doesn't make sense at first... greatness means you're greater/better right? Greatness means YOU get ahead right?
- 4. But dig a bit and you see how genius this is...
- 5. You want to be great? You want to really have a great life? Be successful... be who you want to be?
- 6. Make people your priority. Why?

#### D. Two reasons

- E. **First**... it can change your work into a passion.
  - 1. Seeing people as your priority gives purpose to your job.
  - 2. And purpose creates passion
  - 3. Whether you run a huge company or serve coffee...
  - 4. You can use every day and every encounter as a way to make someone's life better.
  - 5. Going out of your way to show them they are worth the effort.
  - 6. We don't know what others are dealing with... a smile and a great experience can go along way.
  - 7. A coworker who has your back can be one of the most encouraging things in the world.
  - 8. The most rewarding jobs are about helping people... that can be any job you have... if you make people your priority.
  - 9. Making people your priority gives purpose to any job.

- F. **Second**... it's just good for business.... Think about it
  - 1. Who would you rather give your business to... some distant corporation that treats you like just another number or a place that knows you by name and actually cares about you and invests in your community?
  - 2. Who would you rather work with... someone who is obviously only out for themselves and to get ahead or someone who cares about the team and only calls it a win if the team wins?
  - 3. Whose ideas would you more likely listen to?
  - 4. Which employee would you most likely promote?
  - 5. Which company would you rather work for?
    - a. Usual organizational chart
    - b. Flip it.
    - c. Difference between boss and leader
    - d. Boss- you're here to make me shine
    - e. Leader- I'm here to make you shine
  - 6. See being for others is what is good for you.
  - 7. **Example:** customer service rep day after xmas...
    - a. Got the best review he's ever had.
- G. Whether you believe Jesus died and rose again... being for people is just good advice.
  - 1. But for the JF it's not just advice... it's what is supposed to define us.
  - 2. JF's are to model the Jesus we say we follow.
  - 3. Right before he gave the ultimate model by dying for us Jesus gave another great example of what this looks like.

- H. Last Supper
  - 1. Background
  - 2. Customs. No one does the washing... so...
  - 3. John 13:3-5; 12-16
  - 4. "This whole thing is about serving. I, your master and God, served you so you can serve others."

#### I. Yeah but...

- 1. What about that guy who keep stabbing me in the back
- 2. What about that customer who screams in my face
- 3. What about that kid who is constantly testing me and pushing my buttons?
- 4. What about when no one understands what I do for them?
- J. Let's look at who got their feet washed by Jesus?
  - 1. Two brothers who asked their mommy to talk to Jesus for them and get them ahead of the others
  - 2. A tax collector, in those days, the worst type of sell-out/traitor to his people
  - 3. All of them would abandon him by the next day and lose faith
  - 4. Peter would deny even knowing him three times in the next few hours, even lying to a little girl about his relationship w/ Jesus
  - 5. AND Jesus washed the feet of the man who had already agreed to betray him that night. <u>Judas</u>.
  - 6. True greatness is being for someone before they are for you.

- B. Baby steps

# C. Challenge- Once a day for the next 5 days purposely do something FOR someone else.

- 1. Be on the look out for a way to be FOR someone.
- 2. Whether they know it or not.
- 3. Celebrate them publically... to their supervisor
- 4. Write an encouraging note or send a text letting them know you are cheering them on
- 5. Ask what you can do to help.
- D. **Students** tell a teacher that you appreciate the work they are doing
- 1. Publicly say something good about someone else

## E. Retired

- 1. Ask a young parent how you can help
- 2. Have coffee with someone who could use encouragement
- 3. Go clean your kids house when they are at work
- 4. TAKE THE GRANDKIDS!

# F. Stay at home parents

- 1. #1 lie is that you are just a parent.
- 2. One of the most important... if not the most important job is parenting.
- 3. Yeah but every minute of my day is being FOR someone else.
- 4. Reach out to another parent in your situation
- 5. Tell your kids why you do what they do
- 6. Notes in lunch box
- 7. Liz- our kids' doors
- G. Being for others is what's good for you.

#### V. WE

  - 1. Imagine 100's and 1000's of local people seeing their daily purpose as being FOR others.
  - 2. For their customers
