



Main Points

Darkness seems overwhelming... until even the tiniest light is lit.

No matter how dark it gets, the light will always break through.

When we look around us (and in us) we see a darkness that we are powerless to illuminate.

God's love for humanity moved him to break into human history.

For God, mercy and compassion always outshine law and punishment.

God often breaks through the darkness in ways we don't expect or immediately see.

Prayer: "God, where are you shining your light in my life? Break through the darkness and help me to see you and your light this Christmas." (Let lights remind you to pray)
