Darkness isolates and conceals.

The darkness in the world convinces us that we are alone in the world.

The darkness in the world convinces us that we can't do anything for the world.

Christmas is the story of God ending our isolation and giving our lives purpose.

God is so FOR us that he became one of us.

Jesus didn't come just so we could leave Earth and go to heaven someday... he came so that we can bring the light of Heaven to Earth now.

God gave us his light in order for us to BE his light.

Being the light of God means reorienting your life around the love of Jesus.

A Jesus Follower's main question is: What will shine Jesus' love the brightest?

You are not alone in the dark.

Jesus removed the darkness that conceals the purpose of our lives.

You are invited to be God's light to the world.

The darkness in the world cannot withstand the light of Jesus radiating out of the followers of Jesus.
